## SASI P M TAKES THE HELM OF IT PARKS KERALA

**S**asi P M has taken charge as CEO of IT Parks Kerala. He was previously the head of C-DAC Trivandrum and is currently the Director of ICFOSS. He was also the Member of Board of Directors of KEL-TRON, Member of the Technical Advisory Committee of AICTE; Member of Research Advisory of C-DIT and Member, Technology Development and Adaptation Committee – KSCSTE. The IT department issued a Government Order in this regard. He succeeds Hrishikesh Nair, who was serving this role for the past 3 years.

Hrishikesh Nair is moving on to pursue his career back in core IT industry. He was selected during the last Government's rule and in the three-year tenure, he has successfully completed multiple IT projects, which brought laurels to the IT industry of State. He was instrumental in developing the Phase 2 expansion of 125 acres in Infopark Kochi with this first IT building and bringing in the State's first World Trade Center to the campus. His efforts were well recognised, and when the present Government took a decision to consolidate all IT parks under one CEO, he was chosen and given additional responsibility of all IT parks in the State. He completed the first IT building as well as the Mobile Applications incubator at Cyberpark Kozhikode. Under his leadership, Technopark developed its 4th Phase



'Technocity' and expanded its IT space by inviting investments to the State like Nissan, H&R Block, Teranet, Taurus Investments etc. In three years, he could turn around Technopark to a financially stable CRISIL-A rated position, which was truly a defining moment for Kerala IT.

Currently the IT parks are back in a

growth phase – with over 1 lakh direct employment and 700+ companies in the three IT parks together contributing towards software exports worth Rs. 14,000 crore. Also 55 lakh sq. ft. of built up IT space of the total one crore sq. ft. target of built up space is already achieved, and the remaining work is in fast progress.

## KERALA IT COS WIDEN GLOBAL CONNECT AT GITEX 2019

Companies from the three IT Parks in Kerala represented the State's IT industry at the GITEX Technology Week, the biggest IT expo in Middle East market. The Kerala IT Pavilion was inaugurated by Chief Minister's IT Fellow Arun Balachandran who led the delegation from Kerala to GITEX. Fifteen IT companies from Kerala participated in the event.

Kerala IT, under its 'Global IT Connect' initiative for over the last decade has provided a platform for the IT companies in the State to showcase their products, services, get international exposure, build business network and interact on the changing technology trends.

Kerala was the only State that represented India at GITEX and prominently displayed the services and products by the participant companies in the main exhibition hall. The participation in GITEX helped Kerala to promote its IT ecosystem as a brand in the Middle East region. Ac-



ording to an official release from IT Parks Kerala, the interactions with the global IT community at the conclave have encouraged many investors to set up their IT startup companies in Kerala.

## TWO-DAY WORKSHOP ON CYBERSECURITY HELD

A two-day cyber security workshop - RedTeam Security Summit 2019 organised by RedTeam Hacker Academy at Cyberpark Kozhikode recently discussed the emerging challenges and solutions.

Cybersecurity enthusiasts and experts from across the country shared their skills and knowledge in the fields of IoT, Machine Learning (ML), Artificial Intelligence (AI) and quantum computing.

Ashok Yadav, Inspector General of Police and Sasi P M, CEO of IT Parks Kerala inaugurated the event which was co-organised by Calicut Forum for IT (CafIT).

Speaking at the event, the newly appointed CEO of IT Parks Kerala said that mobile phones which have become an integral part of our lives were also posing security threats to society.
